



1. SITUATION

The work is still in progress on all sites. In most of the confined areas there are minor slick of oil, with the exception of Fishermen's Wharf, where the oil is still in major quantities.

One of the MPAC experts visited Jbail (Byblos). The cleaning of the boats to prevent re-pollution of the harbour is now done by the municipality supervised by French expert.

The trainers that MPAC team has trained earlier this week were in action supervised by Henrik Madsen.

The Prime Minister had agreed with NGO called BAHN-LOUBNAN that they would perform the beach cleaning on the entire coastline. The MPAC team has performed a beach training session for their members.

Contact with USAID in relation to their engagement in the Oil Spill clean up are still going on.

2. EU RESPONSE

The Spanish shipment with the Finnish assistance on board will depart on 11 September to Lebanon via Syria.

According to MPAC, two experts from Spain (CEPRECO) are expected to arrive next weeks.

Another Danish team arrived to site yesterday to replace MPAC "B", which is leaving tomorrow. A face-to-face handover was performed yesterday. Team MPAC "C" is foreseen to stay in Lebanon for 2 weeks. The MIC thanks MPAC "B" for their excellent work and for the good cooperation.
