Purpose/objective:

This side event will review progress on shifting Consumption and Production (SCP) patterns towards sustainability over the last 20 years, from the UN to the Conference on Environment and Development in Rio (UNCED, 1992) through the World Summit on Sustainable Development (WSSD, 2002) in Johannesburg, up to the forthcoming UN conference on Sustainable Development (UNCSD, 2012).

- Present SCP as a holistic approach that can generate systemic and transformative change;
- Present progress achieved on SCP, with concrete case studies at the regional and national levels, covering policies, private sector action and consumer choice;
- Highlight the importance of multi-stakeholder participation and partnerships for the implementation of SCP and resource efficiency; and
- Address the need for the endorsement of the 10-Year Framework of Programmes on SCP as elaborated at CSD19 to replicate and scale up cooperation, partnerships and good practices and stress its importance for achieving green economy in the context of sustainable development and poverty alleviation.
