- ⌘ Controls on lead mines, smelters and battery recycling
- ⌘ Removal of lead from homes, soil, products
- ⌘ Blood lead level screening

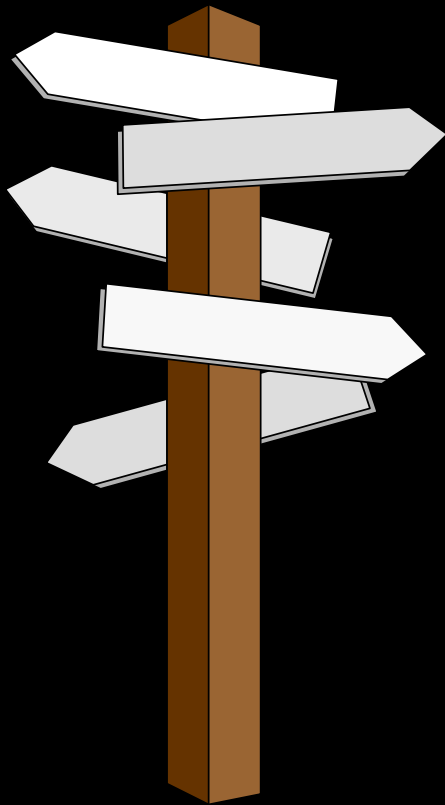
In fact, most of the 400 million children at risk are under 5 years old and live in the developing world ...

- ⌘ China: 95 million
- ⌘ Sub-Saharan Africa: 95 million
- ⌘ Bangladesh: 15 million
- ⌘ Indonesia: 24 million
- ⌘ Egypt: 8.8 million
- ⌘ Peru: 3.2 million
