Program Overview

A&WMA's 7th International Urban Air Quality Forum (Forum) will be held June 23-24, 2005, in conjunction with the Annual Conference & Exhibition. Past Forum participants have emphasized that the unique value provided by the Forum is the opportunity to openly discuss innovative air quality strategies with other decision makers who have hands-on experience implementing and evaluating air quality control programs.



This year's Urban Air Quality Forum is closely integrated with the Annual Conference Technical Program so that attendees will learn both the technical background and application AND implementation strategies surrounding the impact of fuel choices.

The Forum will focus on three critical areas:

- 1) Issues and barriers to multi-stakeholders' engagement in developing strategic energy options,
 - 2) The role of fuel choices on transportation and mobility related concerns,
 - 3) Considerations of energy sources for industrial, commercial and residential sectors.
- As in previous years, the Forum will include, in addition to plenary panels, roundtable sessions that allow participants to interface personally with the panelists. A summary report of the roundtable recommendations will be developed for participants to share with their colleagues.

SuperShuttle

Taxi Service

Taxis are available at the Lindbergh and Humphrey Terminals. Taxi service at the Lindbergh Terminal is accessible via the Tram Level. Signs direct passengers one level up to the cab starter booth, where airport staff will assist passengers obtaining a taxi. At the Humphrey Terminal, taxi service is available at the Humphrey Ground Transportation Center, which is located in the Humphrey Parking ramp on Level 1. Downtown Minneapolis is approximately 16 miles from the airport, with fares averaging \$25. The distance to downtown St. Paul is approximately 12 miles and fares average \$14. All cab fares are metered and include a \$2.25 trip fee, which allows drivers to recoup airport permit fees.

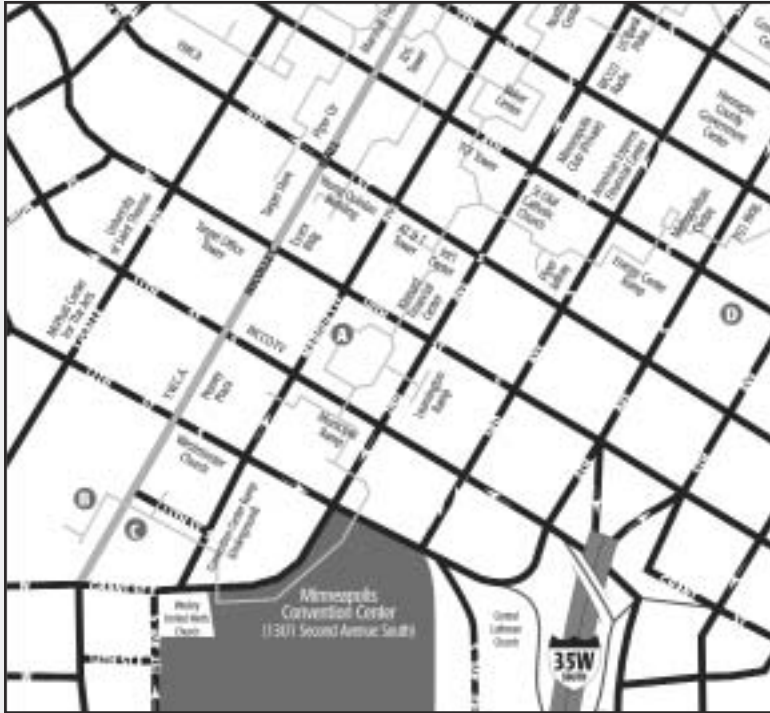
